She thanked Paul Kushner, Fred Conway, and Bob Sica for their services since this was to be their last Council meeting; thanked Douw Steyn for his services to Council, noting that he is continuing as Publications Director; and introduced observers (up for election to Council at the upcoming AGM) – Jim Abraham, Chris Poitras, Dominique Paquin, and Alexandre Audette.

 Thereafter planning will turn to the concept of a "hybrid" (in person/virtual) version.
- A decision will be made in Jan-Feb 2021 as to how to proceed with the Congress (online, hybrid ..)
- DF noted that, in view of the COVID situation, the Victoria Convention Centre had waived all further deposits until the situation is clearer, possibly at the end of the calendar year. No CMOS payments are due and contract status not clear.

3(c) CMOS/CGU 2022 Saskatoon

YL:

- Andrew Ireson of CGU is co-chair. Now have 7-8 people on LAC, but want more. Hoping for at least one member from ISAS.
- Working with Eastern Snow Conference about possible joint conference. U of Saskatchewan is chair of Snow Conference, which normally has ~60 attendees. Issue is revenue sharing.
- Still working on theme, which will be related to water and water security.

4 Approvals for end of operating year/Approbations pour la fin de l'année fiscale

- 4a Audited Financial Statements/Etats financiers audités Attachment/pj #4, #4a
 AS reviewed the Statements and made a number of comments:
 - completion of Statements was delayed due to need for further information re IUGG/Congress 2019 from JPDL (IUGG 2019 organizer). The Statements and subsequent meeting of the Audit Committee were completed on Monday 15-June.
 - CMOS could still receive a further \$37K from JPDL pending their own audit, these \$ are not noted in the CMOS Statements
 - Statements reflect a \$40K grant from ECCC/MSC, \$40K in kind from DFO for office space etc, and a \$20K grant from DFO for SCOR activities. (GG: \$10K to Private Sector Committee covers the cost of the directory.)
 - CMOS received \$8K in donations: important for justification of Society's charitable status with the Canada Revenue Agency.
 - The 2019 Congress was quite profitable for CMOS
 - In 2019 CMOS did have to sell some mutual funds. This was due to the unusual Congress arrangements: there was no cash inflow from Congress registrations etc which created a cash flow problem.
 - Overall, CMOS still suffered a deficit of \$14K. Expenses are up but revenues are overall level.

KS: CMOS should do better in obtaining donations

PK: important to note financial success of Congress 2019 in view of pushback received on this cooperative effort with IUGG. CMOS should look on International Conferences as opportunities, though would need to work more on CMOS profile at cooperative events than happened with IUGG in 2019.

Olatech Contract

AS: cost of this contract is contained under "Overhead Services". 2-year contract ends in July 2021. CMOS has seens limited progress in this service contract – only a beta version of a new website.

• **PK**: the contract should be reviewed. CMOS sought a number of specific improvements re Congress operations: have not seen benefits.

MS: Statements show Centres receive few \$ compared to other budget items, some of which cover clunky CMOS utilities. Members need **real** value, not apparent value.

KS: most attendees at the virtual Congress were not CMOS members: they evidently do not see the value of membership.

MS: EGU Conference abstract fee includes a 1-year membership.

AS: one year CMOS included 1-year membership with Congress fee – success of experiment unknown.

Moved by AS, seconded MS that Council accepts the report of the Audit Committee, its recommendations, and the 2019 Financial Statements, to be considered by the AGM. Passed

4b **Budget 2021 att/pj 4b**

AS reviewed the budget, made comments and handled questions:

Society Operations

AS comments:

- Memberships: number of student memberships growing, but not clear that CMOS is tracking when these members cease to be students.
 - o KS: a change was made to the renewal form, requiring signoff by a professor
- Budget proposes to change in due structure
- An increase of the ECCC-MSC grant from \$40K to \$50K has been requested still in discussion
- Costs for Touring Speaker may be lower than estimated, in view of COVID situation.
- Budget projects an operations deficit.

PK: identified budget for ARCCU high – this SIG is only requesting \$1K

MS: operating budget does not show any increase in staff costs

AS: staff costs are distributed over different CMOS activities, and are increasing overall.

Atmosphere/Ocean

AS: A/O is a source of revenue for the society. A possible increase to budgeted A/O page charges is on the agenda

Bulletin

AS: the bulletin is a cost item for CMOS. Need to increase advertising revenue **New Action Item C5.2**: GG to clarify items included in "Bulletin Renewal-Online" Congress

AS: in view of COVID situation, there is a high level of uncertainty in projected Congress budget

DF: LAC hopes to have better estimates in the fall. Considering U of Victoria (UVic) as venue, but would have to fit with University research priorities. If University agreed to host and offered to cover internet costs, could have positive outcome.

RS: CASA (Center for Astrophysics and Space Astronomy) recently met at UVic, could check their experience.

KS: some possibilities for revenue even if Congress is virtual, though a hybrid format would be difficult

AS: projecting a small overall budget surplus, but could be optimistic. (GG: The relevant attachment sheet does not show 2019 actuals.)
