Your participation in this survey is essential, as the results of this initiative will be an important factor in the development of CMOS's next strategic plan.



The Scientific Program Committee (SPC) of the 2024 Congress has received 16 session proposals, on a wide range of interesting and relevant topics such as: extreme weather, coastal oceanography and ocean modeling, climate systems and their global and regional modeling, the Arctic, and artificial intelligence. In addition to these sessions, there will also be 8 general sessions covering our interdisciplinary atmosphere-ocean science, ranging from theoretical research to applied science, and from the sharing and transformation of scientific knowledge into services for society.

As indicated in the January 11 pre-announcement, the abstract submission window opens shortly (January 22) and closes on February 15.
